

Dr. Iulia Mustătea is a scholar of International Relations and Russian studies with a relevant theoretical and empirical experience. In the earlier stages, her research focused on how the Russian identity influenced the NATO-Russia relations in the post-Soviet world. The subsequent PhD thesis, named “Behind the curtains: fundamental aspects of the Russian-American relations as reflected in the presidential rhetoric (1992-1997)”, applied discourse analysis and the constructivist theory of IR to highlight how complex, multilevel state identity shape policies, while also reflecting on the nature of the bilateral relations. In the past ten years, she has acquired large experience in private and public education. She has published multiple papers and has participated in various international conferences. Her most recent academic work is dedicated to the impact of identity in shaping regional policies, with a special focus on the Black Sea Region. Currently, she is a researcher at the Romanian Centre for Russian Studies.
